## Dear friends,

During his Passion, Jesus called on Judas to awaken repentance into his heart. He did not hold it against Peter who denied Him even three times. Dear friends,

Allow me, in this time that brings us closer to the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to share with you a few true stories, which occurred in our missions.

In Niger, where all our orphans, little and grown, have a great devotion to the Blessed Virgin, every night, both adults and religious recite the rosary piously and faithfully in front of a small shrine of Our Lady of Frechou, Mother of Mercy and Mother of the Church. On February 28<sup>th</sup> of this year, a few weeks after the consecration of the church, Our Lady was pleased to show them how much she was touched by their faithfulness and piety.

Indeed, during the rosary, some stars have appeared in the sky, above the Blessed Virgin. All the people present there saw them, there were one, two, three... twelve! Twelve shining stars, of a beauty and light which they had never seen on earth. Crying with emotion, the children fell to their knees. It lasted for 3 or 4 minutes, and then, the stars disappeared. The children were jumping with joy, exclaiming that the Blessed Virgin had come to see them! They hurried to call Bishop Jean Marie on the phone, to share their joy with their good Father!

At the Hermitage in WI, our poor people have cried so much with emotion at Christmas, when we brought them clothes, toys, utensils and food, and all this accompanied with music! They have shared that they could really sense the Emmanuel, coming to them through the poor, simple nuns that we are. The joy of Christmas was bursting forth in their humble homes, for challenging the cold and harsh weather conditions, we would come to sing them the glories of Christmas and bring them the love of God made a Man, born of the Virgin Mary!

In Chicago, IL how emotional it was to meet with all our poor people again under their tents, more or less waterproof. There also, we provide them with all that they need, and most of all, we recall them through our very presence that God loves them!

In California, the Sisters, going back to take the statue of the Pilgrim Virgin after 9 days, showed a picture of Bishop Jean Marie to the lady who had welcomed the statue. They explained to her that he was the Blessed Virgin's confidant.

How surprised she was! She exclaimed that she had seen him next to the statue of the Blessed Virgin, one day as she was saying the Rosary, at her very home, thousands of miles from Chicago where the Bishop was at that moment. She had never heard of him before, and even less seen any pictures of him! The Blessed Virgin probably wanted to show her that Bishop Jean Marie is really her faithful and humble confidant.

The Most Blessed Virgin Mary transmits her messages to him, which he collects into a book whose title is: "God's Messenger Told Me". She asks him also to do many things: in order to save the souls, nurse the sick, take care of the poor, educate the youth as Christians, in the United States, Africa, Europe and elsewhere in the world.

In Scranton, PA where the Bishop and his Religious renovate a church, including its school and convent; he has opened a food pantry there, even before setting up the heating system in the nuns' building, as he had done a few years back in Detroit, MI. First, serving the poor, those who need our assistance. Then, Holy Mass was offered to the faithful, thirsty for God's love, even though the church was not yet completely renovated.

Finally, the school was opened, because

it is important to properly educate the youth, through quality teaching, a Christian education. The children of the school often repeat that "Bishop's school is the best of all!" and they really make tremendous efforts to study properly. These are children from less fortunate families, and they appreciate such an opportunity to receive free, quality education!

A lady, who benefits from our food pantry boxes in Scranton, PA was saying to the Religious lately that from the way they were taking care of the poor, she had understood right away that the Bishop taught them true charity. She also added: "*How good the Bishop must be*".

Sometimes it occurs that, not finding enough help from men, God needs to intervene directly. Thus, in Detroit, the heating system broke down in October. Winters are very cold in Detroit, MI. The religious remained without heat for two months. Impossible to source the heating unit that needed replacement. A friend of our Order spent a whole day on the internet, looking for that particular unit. But it was nowhere to be found!

By the end of that day: miracle! Someone had one for sale in Pennsylvania, for \$12,000! That was much beyond what the Nuns' poor wallet could afford! Without even mentioning the cost of its transportation. This was a kind of large and very heavy furnace, and so very expensive to transport. That person who actually owned it, on hearing that it was for the Nuns, offered the heating unit for free, along with its transportation! The heating system was finally restored.

From that day on, we were no longer able to contact that charitable soul to thank him. Email and phone, nothing works, he has become unreachable, as if he had never existed. The Nuns understood that it was Saint Joseph himself who had sent them this heating unit. But do not think that God works such miracles in our missions on a daily basis. No! He counts on you, your charity and your support to help Fraternite Notre Dame, each day, anywhere in the world, to assist all these poor people who suffer so much!

Help us to help the poor! And you shall receive the reward that is set aside for the Saints! The Most Blessed Virgin, if She does not pay you a visit in your lifetime, will not fail to be there to open for you the gates of Paradise!
